



This month Go Tell It On The Mountain, by James Baldwin

Go Tell It On The Mountain, first published in 1953, is Baldwin's first major work, a semi-autobiographical novel that has established itself as an American classic. With lyrical precision, psychological directness, resonating symbolic power, and a rage that is at once unrelenting and compassionate, Baldwin chronicles a fourteen-year-old boy's discovery of the terms of his identity as the stepson of the minister of a storefront

Pentecostal church in Harlem one Saturday in March of 1935. Baldwin's rendering of his protagonist's spiritual, sexual, and moral struggle of self-invention opened new possibilities in the American language and in the way Americans understand themselves.

300 Years of Furniture in America Marilyn Sassi, Professor and Historian

When America's first English Puritans arrived at Plymouth Bay, MA it was 1620. Loaded onto the Mayflower were 104 people, including entire families along with their household goods and animals. Because there was so little room, it isn't likely that furniture came with them. They constructed very primitive pieces focusing only on what was essential.

When Fort Orange was built by the Dutch who came to New York to profit in the fur trade, it was 1624. Unlike the Puritans, the first Dutch were mostly fur traders who came without their families. Furniture didn't really arrive in New York until the Patroon system began in the 1650's. Up until then, only very crude objects were made.

This six week series will begin in these very early times and contrast what was made upon arrival with what was shipped from England and copied after houses had been built. Also to be contrasted will be the differences between 17th century New England furniture with the extremely rare furniture made at this time in New York.

Using both room settings and details about individual pieces, the series will illustrate and compare American furniture in various ways. Specifically, the series will compare what was made in sophisticated cities with what was crafted by rural carpenters, as well as regional differences.

The classes are as follows: The earliest furniture from New England and New York (1620's - 1680's), the Queen Anne Period (1700 - 1750), the Chippendale Period (1760 - 1785), the Federal Period (1790 - 1825), the Greek Revival Period (1830 - 1847), and the many examples of Victorian furniture made during the reign of Oueen Victoria (1847 - 1901).











Community Activities



The town of Lenox was the center of the social season in the Berkshires during the Gilded Age, the period between the Civil War and the First World War. Drawn to the Berkshires by artists and writers such as Nathaniel Hawthorne, Herman Melville, Catherine Sedgwick, Fanny Kemble and Henry Wadsworth Longfellow who had settled here early in the 19th century, as well as the beautiful countryside and scenic views of mountains and lakes, many prominent financiers and industrialists constructed luxurious and imposing summer homes in Lenox and the surrounding area. In fact, Ventfort Hall was one of about seventy-five Berkshire Cottages built in Lenox and Stockbridge during this period.

We will be touring the Mansion followed by a Victorian tea and plated lunch on Friday, August 19th

The notation usually takes approximately 8 weeks to appear on your record.

*Point reduction means the DMV will not count up to four points on your driving record toward revocation or suspension of your driver license (11 points).

Your driving skills and learn techniques for crash prevention. Most important, this program is offers risk management techniques. Beneficial to new and experienced drivers, this course will cover visual scanning, time/space management, handling vehicular and traffic emergencies, and methods that help reduce the risk of a collision.
