

aterford Historical Museum and Cultural Center

As a pivotal gateway for New York's immigration and commerce, Waterford and its neighboring communities reflect an interrelated history of innovation, industry and ingenuity. Using traditional and new technologies, WHMCC stirs the imagination, interest and involvement of residents and visitors alike in this unfolding local story of history and culture.



VENTFORT MANSION AND GILDED



The town of Lenox was the center of the social season in the Berkshires during the Gilded Age, the period between the Civil War and the First World War. Drawn to the Berkshires by artists and writers such as Nathaniel Hawthorne, Herman Melville, Catherine Sedgwick, Fanny Kemble and Henry Wadsworth Longfellow who had settled here early in the 19th century, as well as the beautiful countryside and scenic views of mountains and lakes, many prominent financiers and industrialists constructed luxurious and imposing summer homes in Lenox and the surrounding area. In fact, Ventfort Hall was one of about seventy-five Berkshire Cottages built in Lenox and Stockbridge during this period.


We will be touring the Mansion followed by a Victorian tea and plated lunch on Friday, August 19th

Tour time: 11:00 departing Mill Hill at 10:00 Cost is \$35.00 (includes tour and lunch)






Community Activities



LOUISA MAY ALCOTT MONDAY, AUGUST 22ND AT 1:00

Come and spend an afternoon with Louisa May Alcott, author of Little Women. She will tell you stories of her family, life, writing career, and share some of her literary works. Step back in time with historical reenactor Denise Wright while she brings the author to life through pictures, words, and stories.

Denise Wright retired from being an English teacher at Rensselaer High School after 33 years in 2020. Presently, she is a reporter and photographer for The Eastwick Press, a Rensselaer County newspaper, and is a historical interpreter at Hancock Shaker Village. She is a member of the Fort Crailo chapter of the NSDAR and the Board of Crailo Historic Site. She has always loved opportunities to incorporate her love of history and English. She has performed as Louisa May Alcott for various groups such as the Sand Lake Historical Society, Rensselaer Public Library, HVCC 's Center for Creative Retirement, and the Literacy Volunteers of Rensselaer County and has been a participant of the Oakwood Cemetery's "Walking Dead" tour with fellow Rensselaer colleague, Jim Cochran.


