





The opera considered as Tchiakovsky's masterpiece is set in imperial Russia and explores themes of obsession, addiction, madness, and self-destruction against thebackdrop of St. Petersburg.

e seeds of the destruction of the world are sown in this epic opera filled with glorious melodies as a scheming god struggles to keep his power. Set against the rich landscape of Norse mythology a man pursued and a woman in love create a conflict btween a husband and wife as well as devasting dispute between a father and daughter that will ultimately lead to disaster.

Tuesday Night Movies 7 Pm (in the Theater) August 6 – Ninotchka

Ninotchka, is an American romantic comedy released in 1939, starring Greta Garbo in a rare nondramatic role and was marketed with the tagline "Garbo Laughs!" The comedy stars Garbo as Ninotchka, a stern, committed communist functionary sent to Paris to rein in diplomats sent there to sell imperial jewels confiscated during the Russian Revolution of 1917 who soon falls under the spell of Paris and a dashing Russian exile. The film earned Garbo her third Academy Award nomination.

August 13 – Autumn Sonata

Autumn Sonata, a Swedish language film, written and directed by Ingmar Bergman, and starring Ingrid Bergman (in her final film role), Its plot follows a celebrated classical pianist and her neglected daughter who meet for the first time in years, and chronicles their painful discussions of how they have hurt each other. It was the first and only collaboration by Ingrid Bergman and Ingmar Bergman and earned Ingrid Bergman her last Academy Award nomination

August 20 – La La Land

La La Land is an American musical romance starring Ryan Gosling and Emma Stone as a struggling jazz pianist and an aspiring actress who meet and fall in love while pursuing their dreams in Los Angeles. Nominated for 14 Academy Awards, winning six including best Actress and director, the film is regarded as a modern classic and one of the best films of all time for its bittersweet story and for its distinctive visual style.

August 27 – Ace in the Hole

Ace in the Hole is a 1951 American drama film directed by Billy Wilder. The film stars Kirk Douglas as a cynical, disgraced reporter who stops at nothing to try to regain a job on a major newspaper. Not initially well received, the film has found new respect among critics. Roger Ebert wrote that it had aged well "I found while watching it again that it still has all its power because the writers were so lean and mean [with their dialogue] and because Douglas' focus and energy ... is almost scary.. It's as right-now as a sharpened knife."


