October 1 -American Fiction

American Fiction is a 2023 American comedy-drama film that follows a frustrated novelist-professor who writes an outlandish satire of stereotypical "Black" books, only for it to be mistaken for serious literature and published to high sales and critical praise. The film received numerous accolades. It was named one of the top 10 films of 2023 by the American Film Institute. It also received five nominations at the 96th Academy Awards.

October 8 - The Blue Angel (Der blaue Engel)

The Blue Angel presents the tragic transformation of a rigid bourgeois professor into a cabaret clown and his descent into madness as he falls into the spell of a sexy cabaret singer. The film brought Marlene Dietrich international fame. It also introduced her signature song "Falling in Love Again (Can't Help It)". The film is considered a classic of German cinema.

October 22- The Miracle of Morgan's Creek

Set in the Los Angeles of the slight future, "her" follows Theodore Twombly, a complex, soulful man

In this 1944 comedy a small-town girl goes overboard with war-time patriotic zeal and marries a soldier she's only met once. He disappears after one night, leaving her pregnant . . . but she just can't remember her husband's name. One critic summed it up as "Great verbal gags and non-sequiturs, fast paced action, and a thorough irreverence for all things deemed respectable . . . make it a lasting delight."

October 29 -Hester Street

Hester Street tells the story of Jewish immigrants who come to the Lower East Side of New York City in 1896 from Eastern Europe, and who live on Hester Street in Manhattan. When Yankel first comes to the U.S., he quickly assimilates into American culture and becomes Jake. He also begins to have an affair with Mamie, a dancer. His wife, Gitl, who arrives later with their son, Yossele, has difficulty assimilating.
